Syria Situation Report: March 18 - 31, 2020


Mar 18: Russian Military May be Preparing to Use Qamishli Airport as Fixed Wing Attack Aircraft Base: The Russian military reportedly began building out their fixed wing aircraft capabilities at the Qamishli Airport in Hasakah Province. Russian Su-25 aircraft have already landed at the Qamishli Airport, according to a Russian media report. A Russian Air Force officer previously told Russian reporters that Russia deployed rotary wing aircraft and Pantsir Air Defense System from Hmeimim Airbase to Qamishli Airport on November 14.

5 Mar 23: Turkey and Russia Fail to Conduct Joint Patrol on the M4 Highway in Idlib for Second Time: Turkish and Russian forces attempted to conduct a joint patrol for the second time on the M4 Highway in Idlib Province on March 23, in accordance with the March 5 Russo-Turkish ceasefire agreement. The patrol began in Tarnaba in eastern Idlib Province and intended to reach Ayn al-Hawr, Latakia Province, but stopped after just a few kilometers in the town of Narab due to "security concerns," according to the Russian Ministry of Defense. Unidentified militants used explosives to destroy a bridge along the planned patrol route on March 25.

Syria, Possibly Anticipating Escalation in Greater Idlib: A Russian Navy Black Sea Fleet 197th Assault Ship transited the Bosporus Strait en route to the Port of Tartous on March 22. The ship reportedly transported unspecified weapons and military equipment to reinforce Syrian regime forces. Separately, a Russian Dvinitsa-50 ship, part of Russia's auxiliary fleet crossed the Bosporus Strait en route to the Port of Tartous on March 24. The ship carried "at least three military ambulances" and a shipping container, according to a Reuters report.

10 Mar 31: Israeli Air Force Targets Possible Iranian Weapons Shipment at Airbase Southeast of Homs City: Likely Israeli Air Force warplanes launched at least eight missiles from Lebanese airspace at unidentified Iranian or Iranian-backed targets at Shayrat Airbase, southeast of Homs City. Regime media claimed anti-aircraft defense systems shot downed the missiles before they reached their targets. Previous regime claims of air defenses downing Israeli strikes have been demonstrably false, although it is unclear what, if any, damage or casualties the March 31 strikes caused. Unconfirmed reports from Lebanese media indicated the strike may have targeted a meeting between Iranian and Syrian military officials.
